LESSONS LEARNED FROM THE MANAGING PARTNER FORUM

One of the most valuable benefits of ALFAI membership is the ability to benchmark with your colleagues from around the world. The Managing Partner (MP) Forum was created with that advantage in mind and hosted an informative roundtable discussion at the end of 2022, focused on asking for rate increases, addressing attorney/staff salaries/bonuses and AFAs. Recently, the forum has been encouraging the involvement of non-U.S. MPs via the creation of a focus group and International MP call in early 2023. Furthermore, for the first time, all ALFAI MPs were invited to Chicago in July to discuss AI in the legal space, the state of the legal market, the path to equity partnership and selling ALFAI as a global law firm. The lessons learned from these activities will be discussed during this session.

9:00 A.M. – 10:30 A.M. ARTIFICIAL INETLLIGENCE IN THE LAW - RIDING THE WAVE OF EMERGING TECHNOLOGY

Recent advances in cloud computing, data capabilities and the amount of available data have launched massive advances in large language models and other artificial intelligence (AI) applications. The result? Simultaneous fascination and suspicion surrounding ChatGPT and the like. These tools may be particularly concerning or consequential in the legal community. However, it is difficult to evaluate risks and rewards of AI without an understanding of how it works. In this talk, we are going to address these concerns through an in-depth discussion of the foundations of AI, how it can be used and its parallels to commonplace technologies (e.g., internet search and word processors). Through this discussion, we hope to empower you to make educated policy decisions about the use of AI in your own practice.

Betsy Groves, Ph.D., is a computational physicist with over 15 years of expertise in custom software development and data science. Dr. Groves leverages expertise in risk mitigation and software and data quality to build out solutions that provide clear, actionable insights to clients. She has applied artificial intelligence in diverse industries, including building tools for the prediction of animal biometrics and quantification of defects in consumer products. In the legal sector, Dr. Groves has helped clients evaluate software for alleged failures and opined in forensics and intellectual property matters. She has served on multiple panels discussing artificial intelligence (AI) and ethics, recently published on the FDAs approach to regulating Al-based software and contributed to the B11.TR10-2020 technical report "Functional Safety of Artificial Intelligence for Machinery Applications."
